

## RE questionnaire results October 2019

The data shows that 99% of the parents/carers who completed the questionnaire agree or strongly agree that their children enjoy being at our Church of England school.

100% of parents/carers agree or strongly agree that they are happy with the values and attitudes the school teaches.

96% of parents/carers agree or strongly agree that they are aware of the school vision.

100% of parents/carers agree or strongly agree that they are made to feel welcome in school.

Over 97% of parents/carers agree or strongly agree that the school seeks the views of parents/carers and take account of their suggestions and concerns.

84% of parents/carers agree or strongly agree that the school gives them a clear understanding of what is taught in religious education. 12.5% of parents/carers disagree or strongly disagree with this statement.

85% of parents/carers agree or strongly agree that the school enables their children to enjoy and achieve a good standard of work in religious education. 15% of parents/carers state that they don't know.

75% of parents/carers agree or strongly agree that the school keeps them well informed about their child's progress. 16.5% disagree or strongly disagree with this statement and 8.5% of parents/carers state that they don't know.

■ *often comes out of school talking about what he has learned. He enjoys learning about different religions and explained the values of Buddhism-which he made a connection with. He understands the differences and similarities in people and the school work hard to support this.*

*Although I don't know much about the progress in RE it is not a concern to me as I trust the school is doing a good job.*
