### Our safeguarding offer

If we have worries about a child or family and feel they need our support we will follow the these steps:

- Phone call with parents or carers to find out how we can support and gather more information about the situation
- Offer an Early Help Assessment which assesses the needs of a family and helps identify areas of concern. This assessment is completed with school.
- Offer the support of our Early Help Officer (P4YP) to the family who will work with the whole family over an extended period.
- Contact appropriate professionals or outside agencies, if appropriate.
- Refer to Starting Point (Derbyshire's first point of call for social services).

These steps will be supported by frequent communication with parents and carers which may be over the telephone or face to face. Each family will require different support and we pride ourselves in being able to adapt our offer to support every situation.

In serious situations, these steps may be bypassed by our head of safeguarding and concerns reported straight to Starting Point, Derbyshire County Council or if necessary the police.

### What is a safeguarding offer?

A safeguarding offer is an outline of how we, as a school, plan to keep everyone safe. This includes the teaching of safeguarding to our children and staff, reacting to safeguarding concerns of anyone in our community and supporting any families that need our help.

### What is our role in safeguarding?

At Loscoe, we put our children at the heart of everything we do. We understand that our most important role is keeping our children safe. We have a duty to report concerns, offer support to families who need us and contact other professionals when necessary.

We believe every child deserves to live in a safe and happy environment. They each deserve to be respected, listened to and accepted as an individual. To ensure this, we ensure everyone in our school community is held accountable, trained to the highest levels and understands our safeguarding policies and procedures.

### Early Help Assessment

If a family needs support in any area of their life, we will complete an Early Help Assessment. This is a form that is filled out together to help identify what support is needed. This process allows school and families to work together to find solutions and support one another. This may include organising interventions by outside agencies, organising support sessions or meetings and making sure steps are being taken to improve the lives of the children in our community.
